We Are Hoping to Go On a Trip to Israel!

We are hoping to go on an adventure this October. This is your chance to go with a friendly group to Israel! In this column, I want to tell you a little bit about the trip and how I feel about it.

I also want to mention that we're going to be running adult ed programs in both February and March to help you prepare for the trip so you can get the most out of it.

My first trip to Israel was with a tour group. There were 40 teenagers from Waterbury Connecticut and Atlantic City New Jersey when I was 16 years old. We spent 6 weeks traveling up and down Israel including the Sinai desert which was still part of Israel at that time. it was a wonderful trip and I'm sure it played some role in my later career decisions. It was an exciting country then and it's an even more exciting country now.

I studied for both my rabbinic degree and my PhD in Jewish history in Israel so I spent quite a bit of time in both Tel Aviv and Jerusalem. We're going to start out the trip in Tel Aviv and spend time in Jaffa as well. Jaffa is one of my favorite places in the country. If you are able to fly in a few days early you may want to rent an Airbnb in Jaffa and just walk around the area and stopping into the various cafes and art galleries and perhaps visiting the beach.

I went back with the Wisconsin Jewish community for a mission trip during the second intifada, which gave me a chance to see what a tour for adults might be like. It was a one-week tour so that people that worked could just take off 5 days and boy was it intensive! we're going to take a little bit easier because our tour is intended for people who are just a little bit older and don't want to be rushed! There'll also be options to make things easier if you don't feel like walking or seeing a certain thing but you'd rather sit down in a comfortable hotel lobby or a nice cafe.

I'm a big believer in experiences rather than just seeing certain things. So we're trying to avoid the "If It's Tuesday, This Must Be Belgium" kind of whirlwind tour. Rather we're hoping to interact with people in meaningful ways and be able to engage in activities rather than just looking at things and being told what they are. we're hoping to have a hummus making competition for example. You won't be able to bring home any of it with you because it would spoil but you'll be able to grind the chickpeas and put in the spices and mix in the olive oil and taste it with fresh pita!

I will be going on the trip and participating in all activities. So I'll be available day and night if anyone needs anything. The tour director and guide is a very nice guy from England named James McKeever. He moved to Israel and served in the Israeli Army in the Infantry and lives on Kibbutz Ein Gev with his wife and two children. I worked with James to set up the itinerary and last summer spent 3 days with him having him guide me in the Galilee. So I have personal experience with him and I was very satisfied.

Continued Message From Rabbi Kaplan

A word about safety. No one can guarantee anything but we are very hopeful that the wars with Hamas in Gaza and the Lebanese Hizballah are over. Both groups have been severely degraded and a cease-fire has been signed with the Lebanese proxy. Many Israelis who live along both the northern as well as the southern border are starting to return home. There has been a revolution in Syria and a new government is just starting to organize itself. their leader has declared that they will not allow student territory to be used for any attacks against Israel. Israel has taken preventive measures that should insure the security of the Golan Heights even if this turns out not to be the case. Israel also has very sophisticated self-defense measures to protect the civilian population even if there were to be additional attacks. We are hopeful and optimistic that everything will be peaceful and we are sure that the Israeli government is capable of defending us in the worst case scenario.

I do want to say a word about cars. Far more dangerous than missiles are Israeli cars! So when you are walking around any city, especially on your own, be very careful to look both ways and to make sure that you can get out of the way of any car that may suddenly appear! The culture of driving in Israel is very different from Arizona and so it is up to us to be vigilant.

It's a 15-day tour which includes the arrival and departure days so that means 13 nights. we are only going to be staying in three hotels the whole time which means Tel Aviv, the Galilee and then Jerusalem so you won't have to be packing and unpacking too often. James will be personally guiding our trip and as I have mentioned he and I know each other quite well so anything that we need or want he's going to try to help make sure that we get it. He also knows Ellyn and Fay. We were very happy about this because it means that the person making the itinerary and picking the hotels with us and the person actually doing the guiding and being with us staying in and day out is the same person. This made us feel very secure and that we are in good hands.

As the date of our departure comes closer, we will finalize all of the details and know exactly where we're going and what we're going to do in each place. I will be able to then convey to you what would be good for you to know before we get there so you can get the full experience!

if you have any questions, just let me know and I'll try to answer them. the trip itself is under the auspices of the adult education committee which will be putting together a task force specifically for this purpose. we're also planning to have at least one Zoom discussion with James which should be fun.

NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

The feeling of a shared experience, a congregation coming together in Shabbat warmth and spirit: When does this blessed sense of community begin to unfold? For me, it's when we stand up, join hands, take a life-giving breath, and sing, "Shalom Aleichem," the literal finale of Kabbalat Shabbat on page 142 of our Mishkan T'Filah.

Whom may we thank for this enduring yet eternally fresh musical gem? The Brooklyn-born brothers, Samuel and Rabbi Israel Goldfarb. Silent movies needed music to bring the picture show alive, thus, Sam made up melodies to accompany the action on the silver screen. His talent induced his wife's sister to encourage him to explore his musical roots, which were liturgical. She happened to be the grandmother of Sylvia Plotkin, founder of the Judaica Museum in Phoenix which bears her name. She was the wife of rabbi Albert Plotkin, who signed the charter for Temple Beth Shalom. I mention this to show how this anthem we sing is not ancient nor far removed from our current lives. I sang my first complete Shabbat Service with Rabbi Plotkin at Temple Beth Israel almost thirty-five years ago.

Now, returning to the Goldfarb story: It was during a Pesach visit to Seattle where Sylvia's family lived that Sam met Rabbi Samuel Koch of Temple de Hirsch, now the largest reform congregation in the Northwest. He was offered the position of Music Director and over the following three decades there, Sam organized choirs, including the first children's choirs. He also composed, "I Have a Little Dreidel," adopted by the Seattle Public Schools before it became internationally renowned. "Shalom Aleichem," is from his, "Friday Night Melodies," one of the collections composed during his long and happy marriage, career, and life.

Over fifty years ago, he presented a musical and lecture program at Temple Beth Israel in Phoenix. Rabbi Plotkin shared his recollections with me: Sam's family would sing together on Fridays to create the Shabbat ambiance before lighting the candles. Before publicly presenting a new composition, Sam always tried his melodies at home with the family, endeavoring to know if the songs were easily sung. That is how "Shalom Aleichem" was born. Just as everyone greeted one another with Shalom Aleichem or Aleichem Shalom, this singable song would create a genuinely warm feeling, an affirmation of welcome to all. After the song, everyone would shake hands in friendship or embrace affectionately ---remember, this was not for an orthodox congregation.

The Goldfarb brothers believed, as in the Kabbalistic teachings, that Shabbat is open to all and that upon their participation, God sends angels to bless each one. The angels go from house to house and from synagogue to synagogue, greeting us and renewing our souls. Sam said that he wanted to create a unifying song because once we unite in Shalom and save just one, we save the world!

It is reasonable to state that this song has become the standard bearer of sharing the Shabbat feeling of a loving Presence in our midst. How could any thoughts be more ennobling than the opening lines of this now classic song?

"Peace be to you, O ministering angels, messengers of the Most High, Majesty of majesties, Holy One of Blessing."

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE TEMPLE

Wearing a Tallit for Honors at Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley

Members of Temple Beth Shalom – or any other Reform Jewish congregation – are not required to wear a tallit or kippah at any time during religious services, although many of our members do so – especially during the High Holy days. Neither the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) nor the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) require persons who hold or carry a Torah, or who recite the blessing before or after the reading of the Torah or the Haftorah, to wear a tallit.

Dress Code

At the Board meeting of November 17, the Board unanimously passed a dress code for those sitting on the Bimah and carrying the Torah. Honorees should be wearing synagogue appropriate clothing. No shorts will be allowed. Thank you for your cooperation.

When Carrying or Holding a Torah or Reciting a Blessing

TBS provides a tallit rack with tallitot in the lobby just before the entry doors to the sanctuary. These tallitot are available to anyone to borrow for wearing during a service. We just ask that if you borrow one, you fold it and return it to the rack after the service. There is usually a "spare" tallit or two folded up and sitting on the top of a bookshelf along the wall leading to the sanctuary. Any of these can also be borrowed for wearing during a service.

Please let the Rabbi know if you would like to discuss anything related to this matter of wearing a tallit at TBS.

MONDAYS FROM 10 - 11:30 A.M. FEBRUARY 3RD, 10TH & 17TH



The subject matter of this course is based on the book America's Four Gods: What We Say About God -- and What That Says About Us - written by Paul Froese and Christopher Bader. They found that that based on two questions, almost all Americans could be divided into one of four categories. These two questions are:

> To what extent does God interact with the world? To what extend does God judge the world?

Drawing on their study of American religious beliefs today the authors found that regardless of their religious tradition (or lack thereof), Americans worship one of four distinct type of God: benevolent, authoritative, distant or critical.

This course will address why knowing what an individual believes about God is important, and an explanation of the four Gods. Participants will be given the opportunity to complete a questionnaire in complete confidence, which will help each person better understand which of the four Gods they come to closest to believing in. Lastly, we will discuss the impact that ones personal beliefs in one of the four Gods may have in our world today.

ISRAEL, SYRIA, LEBANON, IRAN, GAZA & THE WORLD


