How reasonable is reasonableness?

My studies at the Shalom Hartman Institute and my experiences in Israel during a very tumultuous time

There was one word that was being discussed more than any other this summer in Israel and that was reasonableness. I studied in the Rabbinic Torah Seminar at the Shalom Hartman Institute, a Jewish research and education institute based in Jerusalem. Founded several decades ago by Rabbi David Hartman whom I knew personally, it offers pluralistic Jewish thought and education to scholars, rabbis, educators, and Jewish community leaders in Israel and North America. It offers what we might call a modern Orthodox perspective but tries to make everyone feel comfortable.

Most of the participants in the Rabbinic Torah Seminar were reform and conservative with a sprinkling of modern orthodox and of course a few from other smaller denominations such as Jewish renewal, reconstructionist, humanist, and so forth. The institute's goal is to strengthen Jewish peoplehood, enhance both the Jewish and democratic character of Israel, and ensure that Judaism is a compelling force for good in the 21st century. I think that we can comfortably endorse all three of these goals.

The Israeli Supreme Court has been using the term reasonableness for the past 20 years as a criterion for striking down laws. Does a law passed by the Knesset pass the reasonableness test? If not, the Supreme Court struck it down. The right-wing block has become more and more infuriated by this. They argue that democracy means that the majority, no matter how slim, should be allowed to pass laws that they feel are important for the country.

So, this is what was discussed directly and indirectly at the Rabbinic Torah Seminar. What does it mean to create a Jewish Democratic state after 2,000 years? The Ultra-Orthodox argue that Jewish means ultra orthodoxy and that imposing the mentality and laws of the Ultra-Orthodox are the ultimate good. This may seem almost unbelievable to many of us in Arizona, but they believe in it fully and they want to impose it on everybody in the state of Israel. So what is the role of democracy in trying to mediate between the Ultra-Orthodox minority and the Non-Orthodox majority who are themselves broken into at least two groups based on political orientation.

Every morning we would study in small groups of four or five. Each day there would be a different topic for discussion. The first day it was Creed and the liberal Jew. The second day it was obligation and the liberal Jew. The third day was sacrifice and the liberal Jew. Subsequently we covered Shabbat and the liberal Jew, Holiness in the liberal Jew, conviction and compromise and the liberal Jew and finally hierarchy and social equality and the liberal Jew.

CONTINUED MESSAGE FROM RABBI KAPLAN

Each day we were given a source book with primary sources dealing with the subject of the day. The sources came from the Bible and the Talmud and rabbinic literature and early Jewish biblical interpreters and sometimes Greek and Latin sources as well. Depending on the people in the group and the type of sources presented to us to that day, our group discussions were some of the most valuable studies that we did. Then there was a large lecture by the scholar of the day, each of whom was a fellow at the Hartman Institute. In the afternoon there were workshops. One of my favorites was delivered by Rabbi Edward Feld on the battles of priest prophets and kings that birthed the Torah. Edward talked about the political environment in the time between 1,000 and 600 BCE when the Torah was being edited and redacted into the document that we know today.

There were electives from 5 :00 to 6:30 each day. There was one set of electives for the first week and another set of electives for the second week. In the evening there were large programs of different types frequently set up in a talk show type of format. One of the most relevant was on Judaism and States navigating Israel's future in light of the judicial overhaul. One of the speakers was Rabbi Gilad Kariv, a reform rabbi who is a member of the Knesset. I was truly shocked to hear how serious a wide variety of speakers felt the situation was.

NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

I am delighted to reach the point when we can plan to put together a little band of merry members and call it our choir. This won't be a huge commitment as they will only sing once a month for Shabbat. The music to be sung will all be one part (no sections or harmony, for now) and will mainly consist of the materials we currently sing together as a congregation. We have beautiful robes that had just been purchased before Covid got in our way. Now we anticipate filling those robes with exuberant people. The plan is not to compete with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Our main purpose will be to add more Ruach to the congregational melodies and add to the festive mood of Shabbat. A leader will be the intermediary communicator between the choir and the cantor at the keyboard, as the visual connection is vague thanks to an architectural loophole.

Due to the anticipated size of the singing group (small) we need voices that are not necessarily trained or loud but those that can, at least, stay on musical pitch with the others. A list of interested singers is still available at the front desk in the lobby for additional names, and everyone will be contacted who signs up. Therefore, we intend to hold auditions in late August. A panel of three will hear each 'wannabe' and simply have them sing a few lines of a song from our weekly service or something similar. Also, they will also match pitch with the leader at a piano. Am happy to report that I will be one of the panel, so if anyone needs more information or has questions, please contact me. I will be out of town until August 16th but will answer emails at baruchkoritan@gmail.com and, upon my return, call 602-881-0934.

Singing together is fun and brings a feeling of satisfaction unlike any other. Personally, I highly recommend it and hope that you will give it some thought. Rehearsals would be before the service on Friday evening once a month; nothing too strenuous or exhausting, just good, honest interaction with music. We will "make a joyful noise unto God."

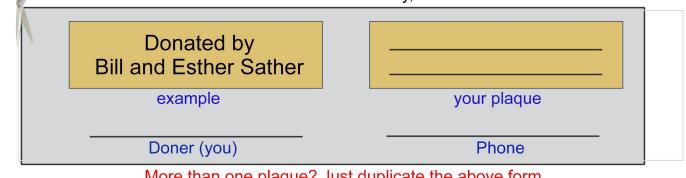
Chair plaques are available for purchase for \$200 each. We only have 30 sanctuary chairs left that don't have sponsor plaques on the back of them.

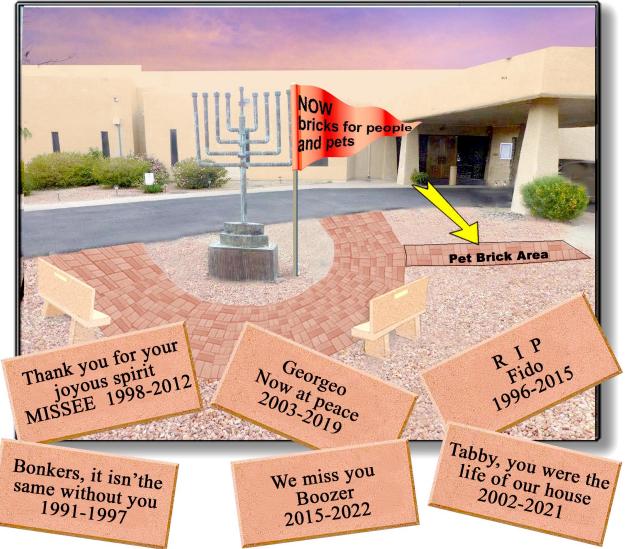



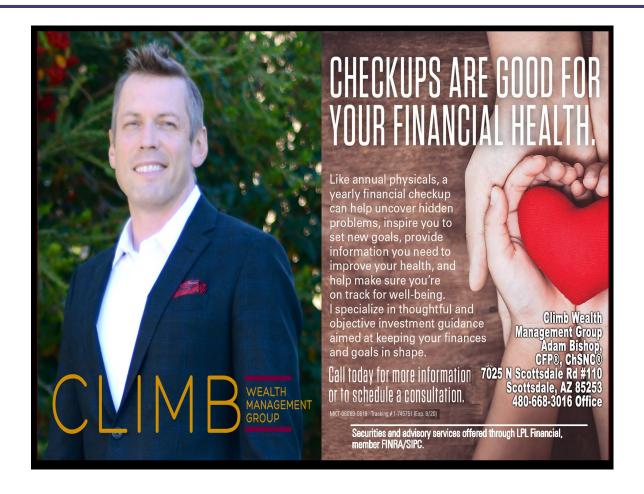
