November 2024 Our Commitment to Interfaith Dialogue

Our interfaith service in solidarity with the people of Israel was held October 7, 2024 in our sanctuary. There was an overflowing response from people of many faiths and backgrounds to an invitation that was spread exclusively via neighboring congregations.

Eleven Christian ministers, one Buddhist leader, three rabbis, and one cantor participated in the service. In addition, several members of our Temple also made short presentations. There were several other religious leaders in attendance.

I wanted to explain the theoretical underpinnings of this event. Creating an interfaith service is part of interfaith dialogue. Interfaith dialogue is important to me as a rabbi. We live in a country where we Jews are a small minority and therefore interacting with other religious groups is of critical importance. We want to understand what they are thinking and feeling and convey to them how we think and feel.

Interfaith dialogue is important because it can help build understanding between people of different religions. We need that understanding more than ever. Understanding doesn't always mean agreement, of course. Almost by definition, different religions are going to disagree on what we believe. If we didn't, then we would all be of the same religion. But there are ways to discuss who we are and what we stand for in a respectful manner that acknowledges these differences while seeking to build bridges between our communities.

We Jews have been traumatized by the massacres that were perpetuated by Hamas and others from Gaza on October 7, 2023. We need the emotional support that we can get from knowing that so many of our neighbors understand what we are going through and support us. We need them to understand how important it is to support the State of Israel in its time of need.

It was so gratifying to see the outpouring of support from so many ministers and clergy and their congregations. It was very clear that many of them are also in need of emotional reassurement. As supporters of Israel, they too have felt the tremendous antagonism from much of American society over the past year. They too have been surprised by the lack of support from many of the pillars of American society that we expected would support our just cause.

It was not an easy task to put together such a service in the middle of the high holy days. Patti Weiner and Helene Fox of Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley played a crucial role. Many of our Temple members volunteered their time to help plan and then to help organize the service on the day of the event.

Continued Message From Rabbi Kaplan

Each religious leader was asked to choose a text that they would be able to read. In this particular context there was no restriction on religious content. We were coming together as representatives of different religions to support Israel and so it would be perfectly legitimate to speak in the name of that religion.

We raised a significant amount of money for Magen David Adom. Our congregation has an ongoing relationship with this organization and we recently heard one of their leaders speak of his work on October 7th rescuing the wounded by helicopter until his helicopter was shot down. Fortunately, he and the other people on the helicopter survived. I think that everyone felt a sense of satisfaction being able to contribute to Israel's medical needs at such a critical time. Doing this as a united community of Jews, Christians ,Buddhist and others was a very special feeling.

Reverend Bruce Scott, the director of program ministries for the Friends of Israel Gospel Ministry, gave the keynote speech on how you can commemorate such a tragedy. He told of how he took a group of volunteers to Israel this past March to show support. He told of the Israelis that they had encountered and the stories of heroism and tragedy that they had heard.

There was Unfortunately ,too much tragedy. They volunteered at the Kaplan Medical Center in Rehovot where the CEO Amos Shavit had lost a nephew in Gaza. But there was also a tremendous amount of heroism. They heard the story of how two brothers had driven into a very dangerous area to find and rescue their sister. They were able to locate her and to bring her to safety. Bruce spoke about how it is important to both remember what has happened and to resolve to stand in solidarity with the victims in defiance of the evildoers. Finally, he spoke about the need to remind oneself and others of the faithfulness of God.

I spoke briefly of having been able to visit the Gaza envelope area on my visit to Israel this past July. On my very first day in Israel, I went with a survivor of the Nova music festival to see the memorials that have been placed there. Each of the 364 almost entirely young adults who were murdered there have a memorial location with a large photo. Some of these memorials are lovingly cared for while others stand as they were created without any additions. The visit was unbelievably sad.

Later in my trip I was also able to visit Kibbutz Nir Oz. I could see that this had been an unbelievably beautiful place but it now was filled with destroyed houses and the aftermath of what obviously had been a brutal attack. About 100 members of the kibbutz had been killed and 80 taken captive of whom 29 are still unaccounted for. We then went to a nearby town where the survivors of the kibbutz had been relocated and were able to meet with one of the people who had been taken captive and freed in November.

We have faith in the God of Israel and we take comfort in the tremendous outpouring of support that we feel from our Christian neighbors and many others of various faiths and creeds and backgrounds. Coming together to commemorate such a sad occasion was nevertheless gratifying and helped to build relationships with our neighboring congregations on the basis of shared beliefs and mutually felt emotions. For the ability to do that, I am grateful to God. To have such wonderful neighbors, I'm grateful to God. For all of the blessings that we have been given, we all thank God.



NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

This past October 24th at TBS, I was singing, "Bei Mir Bist Du Sheyn," a popular song from the 1930's, for the dancing with the Torahs on Simchat Torah. Somehow, while playing the keyboard and singing, my mind suddenly drifted back sixty years. I sat in the Mills Music, 1629 Broadway, the core of 'Tin Pan Alley,' splitting a huge pastrami sandwich with the legendary composer of that song, Sholom Secunda. He was a mentor to me in composition as I was considered a budding composer at sixteen. My choral piece, "I Pledge My Allegiance to our Glorious Flag," had been recently published by Mills. They also handled Secunda's compositions and many other Judaic musical works. Norman Warembud, author of the now classic book, "Great Songs of the Yiddish Theater," had asked the Maestro to work with me. So I sat, chewing and gleaning little gems from the famous man whose latest show my parents and I had just seen on Second Avenue. One of the last big Yiddish musicals, "The Kosher Widow," starring Molly Picon (a native Philadelphian as am I), was partly in Yiddish and partly in English, depending on how the actors felt the crowd reacted in the first scene or two. After the show, I met the composer, the star, and many of the show's cast. They autographed the sheet music to one of their songs, 'Am Yisrael Chai,' with lyrics by Ms. Picon. It was very exciting and the memory of that night still delights me.

Nu? So how did a boy from Ukraine (then Russia), after suffering pogroms in 1905, come to America as a child and already have a name that drew people to come hear him? Sholom was a child cantor and was known enough to perform concerts in New York after his family arrived at Ellis Island when he was almost thirteen in 1907. Mother Nature did her thing and his voice soon began changing. He studied music, taught piano, and later enrolled in the Institute of Musical Arts, the predecessor to the Juilliard School. By 1914 he was co-writing Yiddish shows, directing choirs, and orchestrating. He studied under Swiss-Jewish composer Ernest Bloch, one of the most revered 20th-century composers. Perhaps he turned down what might have been his biggest break: He was approached to co-write a Jewish-themed opera with a young George Gershwin. He turned the offer down. Secunda spent the next several decades writing, conducting, and then during the Great Depression, starving. So, he sold that song which became his most commercial song, "Bei Mir Bist Du Sheyn," for grocery money to feed his wife and two sons. The Andrews Sisters recorded it and even the Nazis liked it in Germany. He never repeated such a huge hit but, "Donna, Donna, Donna," a 1940 metaphoric song (a calf being brought to slaughter, birds flying free, and winds laughing) is still sung, especially for Holocaust events and Passover. Secunda was in nine Yiddish-Hebrew-themed films, and he arranged and conducted cantorial albums for Richard Tucker and Jan Peerce, among others. He died in 1974. His liturgical music, quite respected, recorded, and often performed, lives on.

I hope by now, you wonder what some of the things are that I learned from this prolific composer. Well, first of all, he told me that one has to work every day, not waiting for inspiration to hit you on the head: If nothing comes to mind, write music to one of the psalms. He said he'd written for the same ones many times, always with different results. He didn't seem too thrilled with very contemporary classical composers who were extremely discordant, no matter what the theme or subject. He felt a beautiful rose still has to be expressed in beautiful terms. Period.

Secunda was very gracious and gentle. Years later, I heard that he'd been a very temperamental conductor (threw a chair at a rehearsal), but I wouldn't have guessed that. He told me I had a natural gift for melody, which gave me added confidence. Two years later, I wrote the unaccompanied choral piece, "Har Zion in the Desert," for the ground-breaking ceremony of that synagogue on Lincoln Road, Scottsdale. Not long after I'd arrived at Beth Shalom in 1992, Rabbi Kligfeld, whose brother was the renowned cantor, Samuel Kligfeld, asked me if I would compose a new V'neemar/Bayom haHu for our use as he did not like the one most shuls use. Ya' know, the one that begins with the melody to, "The farmer in the Dell, the farmer in the Dell...", So I wrote the one we've been using for over thirty years.

Perhaps you've heard my song, "Al Tidom, Never Again," most recently performed at the October 7th Remembrance Interfaith Service. Blessings of more than a few giving, sharing, and very memorable mentors do live on for me. Now you know one of them: "Thank you, Sholom"

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE TEMPLE

Wearing a Tallit for Honors at Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley

Members of Temple Beth Shalom – or any other Reform Jewish congregation – are not required to wear a tallit or kippah at any time during religious services, although many of our members do so – especially during the High Holy days. Neither the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) nor the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) require persons who hold or carry a Torah, or who recite the blessing before or after the reading of the Torah or the Haftorah, to wear a tallit.

When Carrying or Holding a Torah or Reciting a Blessing

It is the practice at TBS to wear a tallit when carrying or holding a Torah. Similarly, many at TBS choose to observe this practice when reciting the blessing before or after the reading of the Torah or the Haftorah. Rabbi Kaplan thinks it is a practice we should observe. However, it is not a mandate to do so.

When Sitting on the Bimah

Members of TBS who accept the honor of sitting on the Bimah (with or without responsibilities) during a service are not expected to wear a tallit. However, Rabbi Kaplan thinks it would be nice for Bimah participants to wear one and for our Temple community to see members on the Bimah wearing a tallit. We hope that members who accept Bimah honors will give serious consideration to doing so.

TBS provides a tallit rack with tallitot in the lobby just before the entry doors to the sanctuary. These tallitot are available to anyone to borrow for wearing during a service. We just ask that if you borrow one, you fold it and return it to the rack after the service. There is usually a "spare" tallit or two folded up and sitting on the top of a bookshelf along the wall leading to the sanctuary. Any of these can also be borrowed for wearing during a service.

Please let the Rabbi know if you would like to discuss anything related to this matter of wearing a tallit at TBS.





Rabbi Kaplan is the spiritual leader of Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley in Sun City. He has been traveling for years to Israel -most recently in July - where he studied for his rabbinic ordination as well as for his PhD in history.

Religion is generally conceived to be focused on God, prayer and practice. According to the common understanding of religion, we need to believe in God and come together to pray. In addition, there are usually other religious practices which are considered central to religion that can be called rituals, if they are obligatory and rigid in nature, or ceremonies if they are voluntary and more flexible.

What is sometimes not stressed, however, is the central role that character development can play in religion. Although there are different systems for analyzing and developing character that can be used in a religious context, in this new course by Rabbi Dana Evan Kaplan, he will teach the participants to rely upon positive psychology as pioneered by Professor Martin Seligman of the University of Pennsylvania and others.

According to positive psychology, there are six virtues and 24 strengths as follows:

- Wisdom and knowledge: creativity, curiosity, open-mindedness, love of learning, perspective, innovation, prudence
- · Courage: bravery, persistence, vitality, zest
- · Humanity: love, kindness, social intelligence
- · Justice: citizenship, fairness, leadership, integrity, excellence
- Temperance: forgiveness and mercy, humility, self-control
- Transcendence: appreciation of beauty, gratitude, hope, humor, spirituality

This 3-part series is going to look at these virtues and strengths and see how they might be useful for understanding our behavior, improving our responses to various challenges, and living life to the fullest.




TREE OF LIFE




