Purim: A Time to Come Together and Celebrate

Purim — perhaps the Jewish equivalent of Mardi Gras — falls this year on March 6 and 7. We will celebrate it on Friday night, March 3, with special Purim readings at our Friday night Shabbat services. The Jewish holiday of Purim centers on the reading of the Scroll of Esther, which tells the story of how a young Jewish girl wins a beauty contest, becomes the wife of King Ahasuerus (Xerxes), and saves the Jewish people of Persia. According to the scroll, the Day of Deliverance should be celebrated with gladness and celebration.

There should be feasting (what religious holiday is complete without a good meal?) and there should be as much partying as possible. Jews celebrate Purim by dressing up in costumes, which may be based on one of the characters from Esther's story or something more modern like superheroes or princesses. We read the scroll out loud and cheer every time one of the "good guys" is mentioned, and boo or twirl our noisemakers vigorously every time Haman — the "bad guy" — is spoken from the text.

In this story, Haman wore a distinctive three-point hat, which has been transformed into an iconic three-cornered pastry called a *hamantaschen* (literally translated "Haman's ear"). These triangular, pocket-filled cookies are baked in a variety of flavors. Personally, I prefer the raspberry ones.

In these difficult times in which so many have been forced to seek assistance, it is important to note that one of the central practices of Purim is to donate to those in need. On the day of Purim, a person is obligated to give one gift each to at least two people who are less fortunate. At minimum, the gifts should be either the food eaten at a regular meal or the amount of money required to buy that meal.

It is preferable to give more than this. In the rabbinic writings, the sages say that there is no greater joy than gladening the hearts of orphans, widows and needy people. One who does this is compared to God who, according to the Book of Isaiah, "revives the spirit of the humble and revives the heart of the downtrodden" (57:15).

What makes Purim so well-known and so beloved is the custom of masquerading in costumes. Although the holiday itself goes back at least 2,000 years, the practice of dressing up probably originated among Italian Jews at the end of the 15th century. The Jews of Rome observed the practice of Carnival, which was part of the Christian festive season before Lent. This celebration was observed in February or early March, exactly at the same time that Purim was celebrated. Carnival included parades just like you would see during Mardi Gras today in New Orleans and numerous other cities around the world. Costumes and even masks allow us revelers to exchange our normal, personal identities for those of religious, historical, or popular figures.

While we each may dress up as vastly different characters, the impact of everyone being dressed up altogether paradoxically heightens our sense of communal unity. At this time when we feel that our society is at risk of fracturing, anything that can create more social cohesion is of potentially great value to all of us.

Purim is one of the most joyous of holidays in the Jewish calendar, and yet it also includes some important lessons about familial loyalty, communal cohesion, and how good people can band together to stop evil in its tracks.



NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

"I think that I shall never see a poem as lovely as a tree."

That is such a corny, dated, and far fetched line! So then, how can it be so true? Since the time of the Garden of Eden, our connection with trees has been paramount for survival: food, clothing, shelter, (the big three!) all in one gift from our Creator. Also, we can't downplay their inspiration.

The second day of the month of Shevat (Tu b'Shvat) is our New Years for trees, the Jewish Arbor Day. No other living creation besides humans has its own holiday in Judaism. Many species have Yiddish songs which refer to their particular imagery. "Di Verbe" (willow tree) - love; "Voyl is dem beymele (happy is the tree) - motherhood; "Oyfn veg Sheyt a boym" (on the wayside stands a tree) -vulnerability. Some are in Ladino: "Arvolicas d'almendra" (Almond trees) -happiness; "ala ya shijara" (the pistachio tree) - endurance; and some even are imagined because our people wished that trees had actually lived there as in "Belz, mayn shtetele," in which a line refers to the beautiful trees. In reality, Belz was an ugly factory town devoid of trees. However, all our wistful memories should include dreamy trees.

In my youth, I absorbed the breathing ambience of an arboretum for an afternoon, watching the synchronized bending of many species of trees. I reveled in their blissful obedience to the breezes. One could compose music about it. I did, and it was performed in concert by a flutist and a pianist (your guess as to who played).

The oldest tree on Earth is well over 5,000 years old and is named, "Methuselah." It's location is kept secret for obvious reasons.

Sometimes it appears that tall branches of many species are reaching up to the sky and praising God, which is the subject of other songs. In climes that have four seasons, the new buds on trees after a hard dead looking winter are considered a rebirth of life altogether. Many great poets have heralded that happening.

I will be singing New Jersey born Joyce Kilmer's poem and song with which I began this article. Sure, the lyrics are old fashioned and predictable, yet true: "Poems are made by fools like me, but only God can make a tree." (So there!)

How the Jewish Free Loan is Helping TBS

A few months ago I shared with the membership that last summer TBS applied for a grant from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to provide funding for several projects that would enable us to upgrade our building to make it more secure. While it is our greatest hope that we never experience any serious incidents of violence against our building or our members, we knew we had to do more than just hope. After completing a thorough safety and security assessment of our building, we realized we had to make several improvements or additions to our equipment and the building itself.

Late in October we were notified by FEMA (the Federal Emergency Management Agency) that we would receive a grant award of about \$125,000 through the Arizona Department of Homeland Security (AZDOHS) to fund everything we requested. This will include such things as: improving our building security system by upgrading all the existing cameras on the exterior of the building and installing four additional cameras with 360 degree capability; installing an upgraded entry system on our double front doors; replacing the existing double front doors with metal double doors that are resistant to penetration by gunfire; treating the stained glass windows on each side of the front doors and on each side of the ark with a material that will make them resistant to being easily shattered by a flying object; installing additional bollards or similar devices in the front portico area, and in front of other doors all around the building to prevent a door from being broken down by a truck or other vehicle; upgrading the locks on all our exterior and interior doors; and installing additional floodlights in certain areas on the exterior of the building. In addition, the grant will pay for building security for several months.

This was great news. However, although DHS approved all these projects and will pay for them, unlike many organizations that award grants and provide the money up front, DHS does not operate that way. DHS **reimburses** grantees (that's us) after the grantee has paid for the work to be done for each project. We do not have the capability of or the equipment to do this highly technical work, so.we are in the process of getting quotes/bids from companies to perform this work.

The work will cost around \$100,000. But TBS does not have that kind of money to pay these vendors to perform the work and then wait for weeks to get reimbursed by Arizona DOHS. As you recall, the congregation approved a deficit budget for 2022-2023, so your Board of Directors is working very hard to find income to meet our regular operating expenses through June 30, 2023. So how were we going to pay for this work to be done?

Continued Message from President Fay Henning-Bryant

Those of you who were at Friday night services in December will remember that a representative from Phoenix Jewish Free Loan, Jessielyn Hirschl, spoke to us about the services Jewish Free Loan (JFL) provides – interest free loans to Jewish persons and organizations in the metro Phoenix area. Late last summer, the Executive Director of JFL and Jessielyn asked to meet with Rabbi Kaplan and me to tell us about JFL. The Rabbi and I knew at that time that TBS had applied for the Homeland Security grant and we also knew TBS would not have the cash available to pay for all the expenses associated with the security projects until we would be reimbursed from AZDOHS. So we asked the JFL representatives who met with us if synagogues were eligible to borrow from JFL. The answer was YES. That was good news.

When we were notified in October that we were awarded the Homeland Security Grant, we immediately contacted JFL about applying for an interest free loan. We knew all the money would not be going out to vendors at the same time, because we had to get bids, and we knew there would be significant lead times for some of the work. Also, some of the projects would take much longer to complete than others. If we could obtain an interest free loan from JFL, we could borrow an amount of money we would need to pay a vendor for a specific project, pay the vendor, submit the appropriate paperwork to AZDOHS for reimbursement, and then pay JFL back as soon as we received a reimbursement check from AZDOHS. This would continue until all the projects were completed. We just had no idea how much money might be needed to pay vendors at any one time. This would enable us to have vendors working on multiple projects at the same time.

In November, the Board of Directors passed a resolution authorizing the temple to apply for a \$99,000 loan from JFL. The Board also learned that because TBS is an institution applying for a grant, the Board would be required to "secure" the loan by finding three members of the Board of Directors who were willing to personally guarantee the full amount of the loan. (If any of these "guarantors" were married, their spouses also had to sign as guarantors.) It took a while, but three Board members did come forward as guarantors, and all their personal information was submitted to JFL along with the temple's application for the loan. The process for reviewing our application took a while, the backgrounds of the guarantors were investigated and the guarantors had to be interviewed by members of the Jewish Free Loan Board of Directors.

On January 8, we were notified that the loan was approved. All the documents have been signed and submitted. We are still obtaining bids/quotes for the various projects, and we will be submitting our first request for the first loan as the money is needed.

TBS is very fortunate to have a Jewish organization, such as Phoenix Jewish Free Loan, that not only assists private individuals with a financial need to secure interest free loans, but "needy" synagogues as well. We are most appreciative of the support TBS has received from the staff and members of the Board of Directors of Jewish Free Loan.

This program is based on the book, *America's Four Gods: What We Say About God -- And What That Says About Us*, written by Paul Froese and Christopher Bader. The authors developed a self-administered survey instrument that enables each person to answer a series of questions that provides them feedback about how they conceive of God and the role God plays in their daily lives. Individual survey results are private – they are not divulged to the other participants or the program leaders. Drawing on their study of American religious beliefs the authors found that regardless of one's religious tradition (or lack thereof), Americans worship four distinct types of God: benevolent, authoritative, distant or critical.

This survey instrument findings will enable the participants to see how the belief matrix works (based on their own beliefs), and how they compare with millions of other Americans. Through discussion led by Rabbi Kaplan and Ms Henning-Bryant, participants will be able to see how these findings are relevant to current conditions in America and to better understand how perceptions of God are powerful predictors of how we feel about some of the most contentious issues in America today.
