Our New High Holiday Machzor

An outstanding new prayer book *Mishkan Hanefesh* will make its debut at the start of our congregation's High Holy Days.

It'll be wonderful to introduce these prayer books to you that offer many new perspectives. At the same time, the books are similar to their predecessor Mishkan T'Filah.

I highly recommended this prayer book to the temple I served in Alabama. It was embraced by all and used as I led services to this machzor for two years.

Mishkan Hanefesh: Machzor for the Days of Awe is the Union of Reform Judaism's official prayer book for the High Holidays. It is published by the CCAR Press, the publishing arm of the Reform movement. There is a gold-colored prayer book for Rosh Hashanah and a silver colored one for Yom Kippur. The Mishkan Hanefesh text is in Hebrew, English, and transliteration.

The Machzor works like our Siddur, the Shabbat prayer book. *Mishkan Hanefesh* and is multi-layered. There are three kinds of pages.

1) There are white pages with three basic elements which include a traditional Hebrew prayer, a more or less faithful translation, and importantly a transliteration to allow those who don't read Hebrew letters to use English sounds to be able to read with us even in Hebrew.

2)There are gray tinted pages for alternative translations, poems, counter-texts, and creative readings.

3)There are blue tinted pages for study texts or silent meditations. Many of these readings come from rabbinic sources, beginning with the classical rabbinic tradition all the way up to contemporary reform rabbinical thoughts.

The prayer book reflects a modern Reform philosophy of prayer which includes the following elements: There will be something for everyone. The Machzor offers options for Torah readings, as well as new commentary, study texts, poetry, alternative readings, meditations, and abstract illustrations. Editor Rabbi Ed Goldberg says, "We seek an integration of tradition and innovation, prayer and music, speech and silence, the struggle with God and the struggle with being human."

There is a serious attempt at creative innovation to address contemporary Jewish concerns. Rabbi Hara Person of the CCAR, says the book serves to "embrace the rich liturgical voices of the Jewish past and the aspirations of our people today".

There are varied theological approaches that enable a diverse congregation to share religious experience and spiritual growth without feeling that they all have to believe the exact same thing.

There is an inclusive and egalitarian spirit to the prayers allowing everyone to feel that they are included.

There is an attempt at intellectual honesty meaning that we don't want to say things that we know to be untrue historically or theologically.

At the same time there is an attempt to emphasize the religious nature of the prayers that not everything has to be reduced to what we think might be factual.

It is consistent with Reform Judaism and yet reflects a modern sensibility and sensitivity. Editor Rabbi Ed Goldberg says, "We believe the Reform nature will be evident in its commitment to the equality of men and women; in its faithfulness to the ethical dimension of Judaism and, perhaps most of all, in its effort to deal with the tension between the historical theology of the High Holy Days and more contemporary beliefs".

It tries to be faithful to Jewish tradition and maintains many of the traditional High Holy Day prayers even when some Reform Jews might not entirely be comfortable with them.

There is a good balance between the desire for communal worship with opportunities for individual prayer and plenty of readings that can be looked at individually while the communal prayer is ongoing In this context the title is significant: "Mishkan" (sacred dwelling) evokes communal prayer "Hanefesh" (the soul) reflects individual repentance.

Moving forward, I will be suggesting to the adult education committee that we offer a course on this new high holiday prayer book in September. Rosh Hashanah begins October 2nd, 2024 and we look forward to greeting the new year with our new *Mishkan Hanefesh: Machzor for the Days of Awe.*

Our God and God of all generations before us, May It Be Your Will in the coming year to grant us a year of blessings bestowed and received. Grant us a year of gratitude to you for the most profound blessings our gift of life, and let us say Amen.





NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

The Singing Voice AND the Speaking Voice: Handle with Care!

What is the one and only musical instrument which we take with us wherever we may go? (To the beach, to the chlorinated pool, to loud restaurants or sports events, not to mention shouting matches?) You most likely know the answer: It is our own delicate but vastly important voice. The bad news is that it must do double duty as our main method of verbal communication aside from being a musical treat or aural disaster. The good news is that many tips will be given here to avoid hurting this precious instrument which should be treasured or, at least, maintained.

Incorrect speaking can ruin a decent singing voice, and the fate of the misused singing voice is reflected in our speech. Silence may, indeed, be golden, but a tarnished voice may even lead to medical problems. Let us explore simple means of preserving this unique gift with which we have been blessed.

Firstly, here are some symptoms of vocal abuse: hoarseness, throat clearing, breathiness, excessive vibration, inability to sustain full passages/sentences, inability to modulate pitch, and pain in the laryngeal area. These problems apply equally to singing and speaking.

One creative procedure for improving speech production is to find your optimum use of pitch. The notes, slightly above your lower tones, should be in the median range. Practice saying, "hm, hmm," and then more sustained, "h m, h m m," followed by speaking easily and in a spontaneous manner on that pitch. Use these words, for instance: "hello," "really," "call me".


Avoid hard glottal attacks. Practice initiating all beginning vowel sounds with the letter "H" "Hit the ball," "How are you?" "Have you seen this?"

Also, try yawning aloud and then, on a sigh, say: "you, you, you." Practice speaking on that pitch. Maintain that level at the end of a sentence, not dropping it down or letting it get caught in the throat. Practice words beginning in voiced consonant fricatives, e.g. Z, Th, and B. These will also help support the tones by engaging the dia-phragm. Breathing with proper support alleviates pressure on the larynx, which could result in numerous maladies instead of melodies.

Even for speaking, utilize a technique culled from the esteemed otolaryngologist, Dr. Friedrich Brodnitz. Start a chewing exercise in one's middle range, both descending and ascending on the same five notes on the sound, "myum, myum, myum," etc. This non-abrasive exercise helps place the voice in a relaxed and forward placement, excellent for all usages.

A few simple tips for vocal health include drinking at least six glasses of water daily, avoiding cold air on the throat's exterior. One must vehemently avoid shouting, screaming, and speaking without first breathing sufficiently. Follow these easy steps to reach a healthy level of vocal prowess. Enjoy your voice. It's priceless!

Machzor - Prayer books for the High Holiday Services

When you read the Rabbi's Shofar article this month you will learn about this approach to the High Holidays. It includes new features, and one of the most important is transliteration of most prayers.

We have obtained 100 copies of the books through a donation by myself & my wife. That will cover a little more than half of our congregation.

To alleviate this issue, we are going to have a process to allow members to order copies for their personal use or donation to the Temple. These books will be inscribed with your name and a message of dedication.

The process to order is still being finalized, but will entail ordering online. The orders will be combined into one and then delivered to the Temple for distribution to you. There will be a discount of 20% off the cost for the books using this order method.

You will be notified when it is time to order your Machzor.

Security

The work that the Homeland security grant provided for has been completed. Please thank Fay Henning-Bryant for her work in pushing through the paperwork for this improvement.

The improvements included new exterior lighting, replacement of all cameras and bollards in front of each door. There is more work we would like to do, but the Temple will need to find additional sources of funds to complete new work.

THURSDAYS • APRIL 4, 11, 18, 25 • 10:00 - 11:00 AM


— THE FOUR TOPICS ARE —

The commandment to love your neighbor as yourself. How have different Jewish and Christian thinkers analyzed this commandment and what were the differences between the perspectives?

The synagogue. When did it develop as a center for prayer as opposed to serving a more communal function? What can we learn from Christian sources about the synagogue?

Shabbat/the Sabbath. How does the Bible describe Shabbat observance and what did the rabbis add to this perspective? Jesus talks about Shabbat in several key passages, what did Christians decide to do vis-a-vis observance of the Sabbath?

Forgiveness. Both Jews and Christians believe in forgiveness but how do their views differ?



These two religious leaders and teachers have very different approaches to the subject matter not only because they believe in and practice different faiths, but also because they have different viewpoints about religious studies. This will be an exciting and unique opportunity to learn about religion from contrasting points of view.

Author of the book *The Feasts of Israel*: Seasons of the Messiah, Bruce Scott is a graduate of Central Baptist Theological Seminary with a Master of Divinity degree. Bruce is the Director of Program Ministries of The Friends of Israel Gospel Ministry, a worldwide evangelical Christian ministry founded in 1938. In his current position, he oversees online educational programs, educational excursions to New York City's Jewish neighborhoods, and volunteer trips to Israel.

Dana Evan Kaplan is the Rabbi at Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley, a Reform Jewish congregation located in Sun City. While serving as a pulpit rabbi for 25 years, he is recognized as an authority on the history and development of Reform Judaism, challenging Reform leaders with respect to the future of the Reform movement. Among the several books he has authored, the most recent are *The New Reform Judaism: Challenges and Reflections and A Life of Meaning: Embracing Reform Judaism's Sacred Path.*

TBS member Bernie Arum was honored with carrying the Czech torah (maroon cover) from Temple Beth Shalom as part of the commemoration along with members of other synagogues and their Czech torahs. The Czech scrolls are survivors and silent witnesses. They represent not only the lost communities of Bohemia and Moravia, but all those who perished in the Shoah.


TREE OF LIFE
